Help us know that two are better than one and collaboration can lead to even greater things.

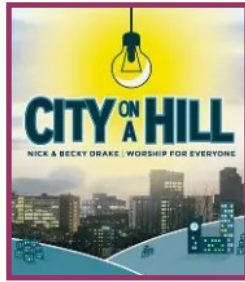

This week's activity



Paper Chain of Strength

Each child writes one strength they bring to a team (e.g. listening, good ideas, kindness, organisation) on a strip of paper.

Join the strips together into a big class paper chain.

Reflect: one link is fragile, but together the chain is strong.

OR

Silent Line-Up Challenge

Challenge the class to line up in birthday order, height order, or alphabet order without talking.

Afterwards, discuss: How did you manage? Who took the lead? How did you communicate?

Explore further at home



Family Challenge: Work together to complete a small task at home, e.g. Bake a cake (everyone has a role: measuring, mixing, decorating).

Build a Lego model or puzzle as a team.
Tidy one room together in 10 minutes.

Afterwards, talk about how working together made it easier, more fun, or quicker.

Ask each family member: "What strengths do you bring to our family team?"
