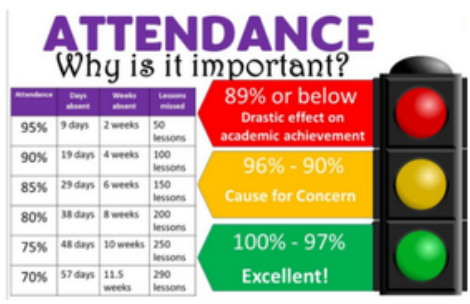

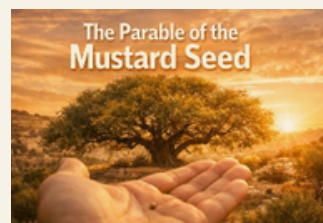

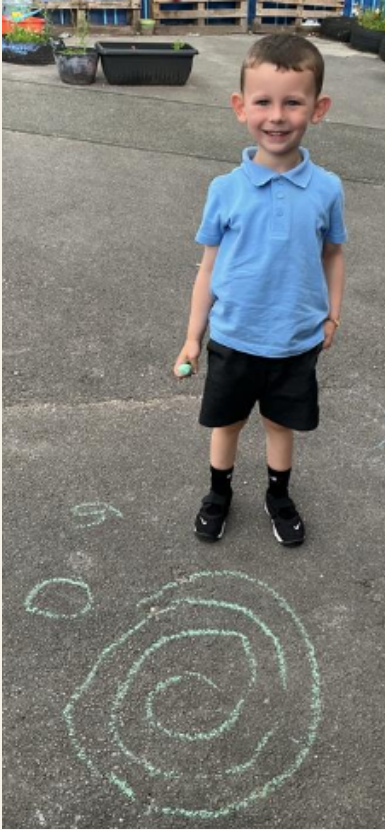




Curriculum Showcase
