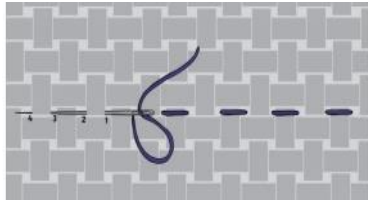
Sticky knowledge

- Textiles are a type of cloth or woven fabric
- A joining technique is to connect two pieces of material together
- A template helps you draw the same shape on materials
- A running stitch is a simple style of sewing in a straight line



Vocabulary	Definition
Accurate	Neat, correct shape, size and pattern with no mistakes
Felt	A textile material that doesn't fray easily
Knot	A join made by tying two pieces of string, thread or rope together
Needle	A pointed tool used for sewing with a hole at the top for thread to go through
Pouch	A pocket type small bag to carry and keep items safe
Stitch	A loop of thread or yarn resulting from a single pass or movement of the needle in sewing, knitting, or crocheting.
Thread	A long, thin strand of cotton, nylon, or other fibres used in sewing or weaving
